



Choose the teammate who
WILL START
the event.

Leave that participant's skis,
poles or board by the gondola
lift **ON THE MARKED
SKI RACK.**



Gather the team together at
the **STARTING LINE**
in front of the Marriott by 11:00 a.m.

On the "GO!" your
designated skier
will follow the route



**THROUGH THE
PEDESTRIAN VILLAGE**
to the Cabriolet. S/he will collect skis,
poles or board before getting into the
gondola. The participant will carry boots
in a pack or slung around the neck.



The participant will put on his/
her boots **DURING THE
GONDOLA RIDE.**

The participant will then do the
agreed-upon **NUMBER OF
RUNS** before doing a relay.



Only participants with a
BRACELET will be allowed into the
TRANSITION ZONE.

Spectators, family and friends must remain
in the zones reserved specifically for them.

Shortly before my turn, I put on a
"RELAY" ARMBAND and go
to the clearly marked Relay Area
gate, then stand at the relay mark.

I stand at the line to wait for my
teammate. I have in my possession
my skis, poles and/or board.
No other teammate is allowed to
be with me in the Relay Area.

When my teammate arrives,
we exchange **THE "RELAY"
ARMBAND FOR
THE OFFICIAL BIB
AND TIMING CHIP.**

Only after this exchange has
been completed can I head to
**THE LIFT AND RIDE
THE GONDOLA UP THE
MOUNTAIN** to ski my number
of turns (decided by the team).

The teammate finishing a turn takes
the **RELAY ARMBAND**
and gives it to the next participant.

The Timing Chip



- Upon arrival, each team must register at the participant's service office. At that time, the **team bib** and the **electronic timing chip** will be given out.
- **NEW*** One member of each team must attend the mandatory information meeting on Saturday December 8th at 9 am, in the transition zone, at the base of the mountain.
- Chips **may not be tampered** with or altered in any way.
- **The chip is not your property and costs \$125. You will be charged that amount if you lose it or forget to return it. Labelled boxes will be placed in the transition zone. Deposit your chips there, or bring them to the 24h Info Area at any time.**
- Each team is responsible for monitoring its own results, ensuring their accuracy, and notifying the timing centre of any anomalies.
- Only those turns completed before Sunday noon (12:00) will be included in the final tally.

24H OF SKIING – SKIER'S CODE

- I'm participating in Tremblant's 24h because I'm motivated by the children!
- I am respectful toward other participants, regardless of their skill level.
- I am respectful toward officials and volunteers at all times, regardless of my ranking.
- I abide by safety instructions at all times or risk a penalty.
- I wear my helmet at all times as soon as I'm on the slopes.
- My bib is fully visible at all times.
- I abide by the skier's code wherever I am on the mountain.
- I never take a racing position.
- I am especially safety-conscious at the loading area, unloading area, and transition zone.
